Scott worked for the past two years managing and coordinating the casting/mold making and figures department for a design firm in New York that works on major retail, theatre and film projects. His work is primarily in mixed media and installation and he has had shows in Seattle, Albany and Brooklyn.

Since 1976, Pratt Fine Arts Center has offered art classes for everyone and workspace for artists in its equipment-rich facilities in Seattle's Central District. Pratt serves 3,400 students each year and more than 500 working artists use Pratt's affordable studios and equipment.
