Conjuntos: Mexico Book Arts Group Show

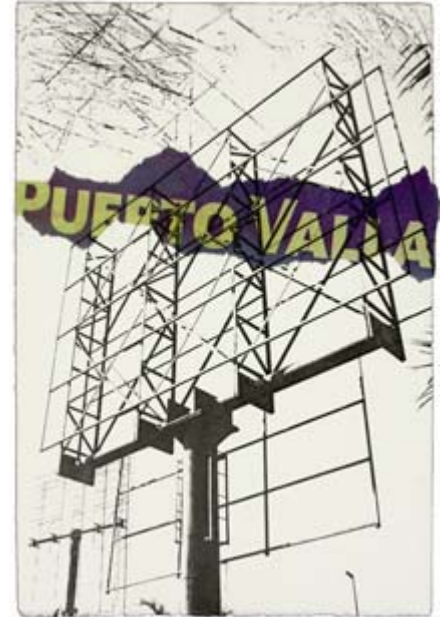
On Display at the Pratt Gallery at Tashiro Kaplan Studios July 7- July 27, 2011
